### **Situation**

HNELHD Nursing & Midwifery Directorate have partnered with the NSW Falls Prevention & Health Ageing Network and the Clinical Excellence Commission (CEC) to present the Rural Falls Forum that was held on the 4th April, 2025 at Tamworth.

### **Background**

This annual forum aims at increasing an awareness and understanding of current best practice for the prevention of injury as a result of falling including assessing for risk and implementing falls minimisation strategies.

Additionally, throughout April HNELHD Nursing & Midwifery Directorate are leading a series of Webinars that will provide valuable insights into falls prevention strategies including:

- Falls Health Check: Its everyone's business 16th April
- Falls Case Study: Quality Improvement in a High-Risk Setting 30<sup>th</sup> April

Participants were given the opportunity to provide feedback at the conclusion of the forum via a QR code, which including their overall assessment of the day, their own learning and information gained, and any other further comments or recommendations for future forum. A total of 63 responses were received and the results are as follows:

- The overall forum rated at 4.63 (1=poor, 5=outstanding)
- Key Messages that participants gained from the Forum include:
  - Falls are complex and there are many contributing factors
  - Exercise reduces falls
  - Bone density and the importance of this to prevent falls and fractures
  - Prevention is the best pathway for clinicians
  - The importance of mobility and nutrition to prevent falls
  - Must have a collaborative approach to prevent falls
  - Hospital Acquired Infections is the leading cause of adverse health outcomes and can lead to a fall
  - Strength exercises and how to approach this with a confused patient
  - o Focus needs to shift to prevention for our ageing population
  - How to care for patients with dementia
- What would you like to hear about at future events?
  - Activities essential for falls prevention
  - Role of the OT in falls prevention
  - Projects occurring across the District
  - How remote sites can access support compared to TRRH and Armidale
  - Case studies showcasing how disciplines work together on falls prevention
  - Exercise specific information for Nurses
  - Ongoing research and management of falls
  - Effective risk mitigation for emergency departments
  - Inclusion of Mental Health
  - Geriatricians as speakers
  - How the Joy of Movement program progresses and incorporated into other areas across HNELHD
  - More education on BPSD management for all areas inpatient, aged care and community
  - More on dementia care for patients
  - More information related to the geriatric population and their health


